



The UCI World Cycling Centre (CMC) in Aigle is an outstanding multi-sport facility. It is used by the Union Cycliste Internationale (UCI) as a training centre and features a 200m Velodrome and BMX Super X track. Inaugurated in 2002, it welcomes a large number of athletes from around the world who devote all their energy to their sports career. The WCC trains and develops about 100 athletes a year in four Olympic disciplines (road, track, MTB and BMX).

In your capacity as WCC Coach and athlete multicultural liaison Officer, you will be in charge of training, educating, developing and coaching athletes following training at the WCC.

Main responsibilities and tasks

COACH

- Provide high level coaching to BMX and MTB discipline athletes
- Provide coaching support for the Road and Track disciplines
- Set clear and achievable objectives for athletes under his/her responsibility, keeping in mind the long-term athlete development principles/country of origin
- Ensure that athletes are informed of and follow the WCC Code of Conduct and Anti-Doping regulations regarding conduct at WCC, Residence "Mon Sejour" and competitions
- Write an assessment for each athlete under his/her responsibility at the end of the training period for each athlete/every 3 months
- Attend regular meetings/provide regular feedback to managers.

MULTI-CULTURAL LIAISON OFFICER

- To live in at the WCC residence Mon Sejour
- Ensure that athletes under WCC responsibility are treated fairly and with care and consideration at any times
- Responsible for athlete integration into the WCC and Aigle commune, particularly the athletes from WCC Africa
- Provide support for all WCC development athletes at the residence Mon Sejour, outside of their training hours (education, cultural, social)
- Deliver training/Coach education to member National Federations, particularly in Africa
- Deliver training to development coaches or interns at the WCC under his/her responsibility.

- Experience as a high-level BMX/MTB athlete
- Have excellent knowledge of specific training techniques and tactics pertaining to the discipline
- Excellent group management and organisational skills
- Experience working with young sports people, preferably in Africa
- Experience in project management in a sporting environment



- Coach developer experience, preferably in Africa/South America
- Be flexible in the management of his/her schedule and available for work at weekends and on public holidays as required by the role.
- Flexibility to travel abroad at weekends.
