



The Cycling Road competition at the Tokyo 2020 Paralympic Games will be held from Tuesday 31 August to Friday 3 September 2021. All Cycling Road events will be held at Fuji International Speedway. The competition will consist of 34 medal events, summarised below:

A combined total of 230 athletes may take part in the Cycling Road and Cycling Track competition. This number comprises 150 male and 80 female athletes.

Competition format

The road races are mass start events, and the first rider in each event to cross the finish line will be declared the winner. For the time trials, riders will start at fixed intervals, and the fastest rider over the course in each event will be declared the winner.

The following classification codes are used for Cycling Road events: C (Cycling), H (Handbike), B (Tandem) and T (Tricycle).

There will be three (3) different courses at Fuji International Speedway to allow for the different distances and classifications of each event.

Rules

All cycling competitions will be held in accordance with the editions of the documents that are in force at the time of the Games.

The UCI, working with Tokyo 2020 cycling competition management, will be responsible for the technical control and direction of the cycling competitions at the Tokyo 2020 Paralympic Games.

Clothing and equipment

Clothing and equipment used by athletes and other participants in all cycling competitions at the Paralympic Games must comply with the documents listed below.

Timing devices

Each rider will be issued with a transponder that must be used during the road events. The transponder will be issued with the body numbers after the team managers' meeting. The transponder must be installed on the front fork as low as possible, and will come provided with a cable tie to fix it to the front fork or as otherwise advised. The transponder will be collected after each athlete's last event on the flow from the mixed zone at the exit from the FOP. In case of a rider DNF or bicycle change during the race, the units must be returned directly to the Omega official timekeeper at the finish line.





Radio tour

Radio tour will be only provided for Time Trial races.

Following vehicles for time trials

For time trial, following cars will be authorized according to the following terms:

- One following car for a nation with up to six riders involved in the individual time trial, all sport classes combined.
- Two following cars for a nation with 7-12 riders involved in the individual time trial, all sport classes combined.
- Three following cars for a nation with 13-19 riders involved in the individual time trial, all sport classes combined.
- Four following cars for a nation with over 20 riders involved in the individual time trial, all sport classes combined.

The president of the commissaires panel can reduce the number of accredited vehicles if he considers it appropriate. All vehicle drivers must hold a UCI license issued by their national federation.

Time trial starting provisions

The starting order shall be determined by the UCI. There will be intervals of 1 minute between riders in each category and 3 to 5 minutes between classes. A rider is considered entered for Cycling Road if the rider is listed on the 'Entry List by NPC'. After confirmation of starters, the entry list will be published together with start lists.

Feed zones and litter zones

The left side feeding zone will be available for the road races situated in pit lane with feeding on left side. The right side feeding zone will be available for the road races located at the wide track area about 100m before the entry to the pit lane, for feeding on the right.

To limit the number of personnel in the feed zone a certain number of wrist bands will be distributed to teams during rider confirmation.

The litter zones will be situated before the right hand feeding area.

Mechanical assistance zone

A mechanical assistance zone will be set up at the beginning of the feed zone for team mechanics to provide static mechanical assistance. Further static assistance points may be made available on the course at the discretion of Tokyo 2020 and the commissaires.

Lapped Rider

Road race

Any riders overtaken by the leader of their race shall continue competing. When the race leader finishes his last lap, all other riders shall end their race when they next cross the finish line.

Team Relay

When a rider from an NPC is lapped by the leader of the race, the NPC should be pulled out of the race and will be shown in the results as lapped.

Doping control

Tokyo 2020 is committed to delivering a world-class anti-doping programme during the Tokyo 2020 Paralympic Games. Under the direction of the International Paralympic Committee (IPC), the Tokyo 2020 anti-doping programme will ensure the integrity of sport is upheld and protect the rights and health of the athletes.

During the period of the Tokyo 2020 Paralympic Games (the Games), which starts from the opening of the Paralympic Village on 17 August 2021 up to and including the day of the Closing Ceremony on 5 September 2021 inclusively, the IPC Anti-Doping Code will apply.

Athletes qualified and registered by their NPC may be tested at any time during the Games Period, as well as in the lead up to the Games, regardless of their location.

Doping control-related operations

Tokyo 2020 Anti-Doping Programme is managed by the International Paralympic Committee (IPC). The IPC directs and oversees testing operations, including athlete selection.

Tokyo 2020 will introduce a paperless system to record the information related to the sample collection procedure by its Sample Collection Personnel (SCP). While the notification of athletes will be recorded on paper, the recording of the information related to the sample collection procedure will be done on a tablet.

Please note that athletes who have been selected for doping control will not be permitted to take a shower until they have completed the sample collection session.

Victory ceremonies

The first three (3) riders from each event must attend the victory ceremony which will take place after the last competitor crosses the finish line in each session. Athletes must wear their NPC tracksuits at the victory ceremony. For the Team Relay, all three athletes from the top three teams must attend the victory ceremony.

Classification

Classification provides a structure for Paralympic competition. Athletes competing in para-sports have an impairment that leads to a competitive disadvantage. Classification determines who is eligible to compete in a para-sport and groups the eligible athletes into sport classes according to the impact of impairment on specific sport activities. The classification system minimises the impact of impairments on sport performance and ensures the success of an athlete is determined by skill, fitness, power, endurance, tactical ability and mental focus.

All athletes at the Tokyo 2020 Paralympic Games must comply with their respective sport's eligibility criteria, as stipulated in the Tokyo 2020 Paralympic Games Qualification Guide. This also applies to athletes nominated by their NPC using a Bipartite Commission application, by a Universality Wild Card (UWC) application, or as substitutes between the final entries deadline and the Delegation Registration Meeting (DRM) if applicable.

Athlete-specific classification data (sport class and sport class status) will be uploaded onto the Sport Entries system from the Classification Master Lists provided to Tokyo 2020 by the respective International Federations by 25 June 2021. However, athletes with a sport class status of 'Review' will be subject to classification evaluation in Tokyo unless the classifications have been completed by the time immediately prior to the Tokyo 2020 Paralympic Games.

Classification Evaluation Period for Cycling Road: Physical Impairment: 29 August 2021

All information was correct at the time of publication in August 2021. Please refer to the Classification Guide published by IPC in order to check the latest information.

Penalties

The UCI penalty scale is the only one applicable to Tokyo 2020 Cycling Road events.

Venue access on 24-25 August 2021

Teams have access to team parking and team tent at Fuji international Speedway on 24 and 25 August 2021 for preparation e.g. equipment drop-off, unpacking, set up.

- Venue is open to teams from 10:00 to 16:00
- Access control is operational
- Teams need to enter the venue according to the prescribed COVID-19 countermeasure procedures
- · Teams do not have access to FOP
- Ice, water and food will not be provided at venue (these will be provided from the first day of official training period on 26 August 2021
- · Training in pit is prohibited

Official training

Official training for Cycling Road will take place within Fuji International Speedway. Training is open to all teams at times suitable to the individual NPC. Instructions from Tokyo 2020 management regarding safety must be followed.

The venue will open for training from 26 August until 30 August 2021. Training hours are as the following.

Team vehicles will not be allowed to follow athletes training around Fuji International Speedway. Speed limits must be respected when driving on public roads following riders.

Course familiarisation

Road race (course familiarisation)

For the road race competitors, the familiarisation for the road race course which takes riders outside Fuji International Speedway will be held on 29 August 2021 with full course closure between 15:00 and 17:00. The road race is the only event that takes riders outside Fuji International Speedway, all other events are confined to within the speedway. NPC's will be restricted to one vehicle on the course following the road course familiarisation. Even though the FOP is closed athletes and teams must take care during the course familiarisation. Handcycle athletes must put a flag on their handcycle for safety.

Neutral service

Neutral service will be available to competing athletes throughout races and at venues, offered in accordance with UCI technical regulations. The neutral service will be provided by two cars during competition days and by a venue team at Fuji International Speedway on training days from the 29 August 2021.

Team managers' meetings

A maximum of two NPC team leaders can attend the meeting to be held in accordance with the UCI Regulations in the presence of the Commissaire President, IF Technical Delegates, ITOs, Tokyo 2020 cycling manager, Tokyo 2020 cycling road discipline manager and doping control officers. All team managers are required to attend the meeting, which will provide critical information on subjects such as venue access, accreditation, protocols and feed zone operations. The team managers meeting will be held in the drivers' room 1st floor at Fuji International Speedway at 14:00 on 30 August 2021.

Confirmation of starters, distribution of numbers and transponders

A representative from each NPC must attend in order to confirm their starters and collect their riders' numbers and transponders. Riders in all events must have transponders fixed to their bikes. Transponders and installation instructions will be distributed with the race numbers. All NPCs must present licences for all entered riders and team staff. NPCs must also present an example of the race clothing that will be worn by their riders in order to ensure that it complies with the IPC Manufacturer Identification Guidelines for the Tokyo 2020 Paralympic Games.

The confirmation of starters will be conducted in the drivers' room on the 1st floor of Fuji International Speedway from 09:00 to 12:00 on 30 August 2021.

Team cars

All NPCs will receive a 'cycling vehicle' with roof racks with capacity for six complete bikes and wheels, or four complete bikes. The type of vehicle will depend on the team size. The model of the car is Toyota Corolla Touring and they will be distributed at Fuji International Speedway from 15 August 2021, allowed after the DRM. The cars need to be returned by NPCs to the same location before 13:00 on 4 September 2021 at the latest.

Team leaders have to present the UCI license for all following drivers for the time trial during riders' confirmation 30 August 2021. Team leaders shall also indicate which riders they will follow.

The Tokyo 2020 'cycling vehicle' will be identified with a VAPP (light blue P6 SCY) giving access to Izu Velodrome, Fuji International Speedway, Cycling accommodation (Road and Track) and Paralympic Village.

NPCs should inform the Tokyo 2020 vehicle supervisor by 26 August 2021 of the number plates of any extra vehicle they may have obtained via rate card or hired in order to park inside Fuji International Speedway.

All the cars used by NPCs should comply with the IPC Handbook and the IPC Manufacturer Identification Guidelines for the Tokyo 2020 Paralympic Games.

Parking and access

Parking for NPC race vehicles is available within the competition venue near to the team pits. This parking area is restricted to NPC race vehicles only. Cars following the race will be identified with nation stickers.

Extra NPC cars allowed access to the venue will park near the team pits for equipment and team member drop off. Access to this area is only allowed for these vehicles with the appropriate identification.

Vehicles during competition

Road race

For road races no team vehicles are allowed.

Time Trial

Teams that have riders in the time trial will be allowed to follow their rider/riders.

Driver safety

All drivers are reminded of their obligations to ensure the safety of all riders on the course, the general public, and other drivers within the race by exercising caution while operating a vehicle on the field of play. NPCs should always nominate experienced drivers to operate their vehicles.

All vehicles should drive on the left-hand side of the road and maintain a line to allow riders and overtaking vehicles on the right. All service must take place on the left.

Vehicles should operate at a safe speed and follow the directions of commissaires and race management.

Radios

Distribution of radios for ITT Radio tour will start after the Team Leaders Meeting at Fuji International Speedway. The radios must be returned after the ITT race.

Any NPC planning to use its own radio system for their own communications must register their devices beforehand by contacting spectrum@tokyo2020.com.

Upon arrival and before use within any venue, all radio equipment must be authorised by the spectrum management. Only tagged radio equipment may be operated within venues.

Cycling bottles and feeding musettes

Cycling bottles and feeding musettes will be provided to all cycling road athletes. Bottles and musettes will be distributed in each team pit area before the first day of official practice.

Please note that all cycling bottles and feeding musettes used in training and competition must meet the requirements of the IPC Handbook and the IPC Manufacturer Identification Guidelines for the Tokyo 2020 Paralympic Games.



Cycling Road accommodation

During the Tokyo 2020 Paralympic Games, the Cycling Road accommodation (Fuji Lake Hotel, Fuji View Hotel and Highland Resort Hotel & Spa in Yamanashi Prefecture) will house Cycling Road athletes and team officials.



Fuji International Speedway is a motor racing circuit south-west of Tokyo and is set in the shadows of the majestic Mt Fujiyama. The circuit, used by a number of international motorsport series, boasts the latest technology and facilities required at a world-class sporting event, and will serve as the venue of all Paralympic Cycling Road events.

Facilities

Facilities at Fuji International Speedway will include:

- changing rooms (separate facilities for men and women)
- · lounges for athletes and officials
- · catering services
- space for bicycle maintenance and repair services
- · wheelchair, orthotics and prosthesis repair station
- · team tent and preparation areas
- warm-up area with rollers
- · mixed zone where accredited media interview athletes after competition
- · sport information desk
- medical services
- doping control station

Bike storage and transport

Bike storage


At the Cycling Road accommodation, bikes must be stored in the storage areas advised at each hotel. This is not a secure lockable individual space.

Bike transport


A Tokyo 2020 Logistics transport truck will accompany TA buses several times a day to and from the venue and accommodation. At Games-time, the truck service timetables will be available at Sport Information Desks at Fuji International Speedway and Cycling Road accommodation.

Athletes' and team officials' transport

Tokyo 2020 Transport will transfer athletes between the Cycling Road accommodation and the venue. At Games time, bus service timetables will be available at Sport Information Desks at Fuji International Speedway and Cycling Road accommodation.

Athletes' Lounge

The Athletes' Lounge in each venue will include seating, televisions showing the competition feed, a refreshment station, and the SID.

Food and beverage

Athlete Venue Meals (AVMs) in the form of Cold-Packed Meals (CPM) will be available in Athletes' Lounge at Fuji International Speedway for athletes and team officials who spend more than four hours out of the Para Cycling Road accommodation for competition or official training. AVMs must be ordered by 10:00, two days before the competition or official training day. AVM orders will be available from 26 August until 3 September 2021. The AVMs will be delivered to the Athletes' Lounge and will include items such as sandwiches, salads, pieces of fruit, dessert, and yoghurt. A vegetarian option will also be available, but it must be requested at the time of ordering.

Fuji International Speedway will have a refreshment station which will contain whole fruit, bottled water, Powerade and other Coca-Cola beverages located in the Athletes' Lounge.

Sport Information Desk (SID)

The SID at Fuji International Speedway is located in the Athletes' Lounge, on the second floor in the Fuji International Speedway. It will be open from the first day of official training to the end day of competition days with operational hours below:

Training

The venue will be open for training from 26 August 2021. Training is open to all teams at times suitable to the individual NPC. Instructions from Tokyo 2020 management regarding safety must be followed. Team vehicles will not be allowed to follow athletes training around Fuji International Speedway. Speed limits must be respected when driving on public roads following riders.

Ice and water distribution

Ice will be available in the hotels and in venue on competition days. Bottled water and Powerade will be available in the Athletes' Lounge. Bottled water will also be distributed to a representative of each NPC on the days of the team leaders' meetings.

Team tents

Each team will be provided an area on the ground level inside the building at Fuji International Speedway for team preparation. Spaces will be equipped with chairs, table and bike rack.

Rollers

Tokyo 2020 will provide a limited number of rollers. They will be available from the Sports Equipment Storage, located in the building next to the team pits area from where they need to be signed in and out. NPCs will be charged for any equipment that is not returned or is returned in a badly damaged condition. A warm-up area with rollers will also be available in the start area for Time Trial.

Towels

There will be towels available from sport equipment storage at the venue during competition periods. Please note that towels will not be available during training periods.

Internet access

Free wi-fi internet access is available in the Athletes' Lounge.

Victory ceremony preparation tent

A preparation area will be available for the preparation of the athletes for the victory ceremony. Access to this tent will be limited to one person per NPC.

Accredited team seating

At Fuji International Speedway, accredited seating for same-sport athletes will be in the stands near press tribunes. Athletes and team officials will need venue accreditation to access this area.

Medical services and facilities

NPC Team Doctors

NPC team doctors must register in advance with Tokyo 2020 to provide medical services to members of their delegation during the Games. Registration is free of charge.

In cases where it is necessary for NPC delegation members to be transferred to a hospital, an NPC team doctor may accompany the patient and discuss clinical management with the hospital medical team. The hospital medical team will provide treatment as the NPC team doctor is not permitted to practice at hospitals in Japan. The clinical responsibility reverts to the NPC team doctor upon discharge from the hospital. NPC team doctors will be able to prescribe medicine at the pharmacy in the Paralympic Village polyclinic and request imaging and laboratory testing.

Competition venue athlete medical services

At least one (1) dedicated athlete medical station will be present at all official Tokyo 2020 competition and training venues. Each medical station will provide services such as first aid and emergency care to athletes, team officials and technical officials. Athlete medical stations will be equipped with essential first aid and emergency equipment. Ambulance units will be stationed at all official Tokyo 2020 competition venues and some training venues. Ambulance teams will be made up of three (3) people, including one (1) or more paramedic. All ambulance team members are ALS (Advanced Life Support) compliant, according to the Japanese law.

Field of play response

Field of play (FOP) response teams will provide first aid and emergency services to athletes and officials on the FOP should such services be required. If necessary, the patient will be retrieved from the FOP and transported to the athlete medical station, polyclinic or designated hospital as appropriate. The order of response on the FOP and any decision-making will differ in each venue in accordance with the rules of the respective IF.

Spectator medical services

All official Tokyo 2020 competition venues will have at least one (1) spectator medical station stocked with appropriate equipment, supplies and medication, and will be staffed by experienced medical staff. First aid and emergency medical services will be provided to all other client groups, including spectators, workforce, media, sponsors, volunteers, contractors, VIPs and Paralympic Family. There will also be teams of first responders circulating throughout the venue to respond to any medical situation that occurs.

Official training venue medical services

Medical services at official training venues will depend on the size of the venue, the number of sports taking place, and the relevant IF regulations.

Designated Games Hospitals

If the necessary medical services cannot be provided at the Paralympic Village polyclinic or at the venue medical station, the athlete or team official will be transferred to designated Games hospitals in central Tokyo or in the co-host city.

The designated Games hospital for Cycling Road is:

Any patient suffering from a life-threatening condition that may occur in any of the venue zones will be taken to the nearest hospital.




Cycling Track venue


Cycling overview map












Time Trial - Last 3km

After the end of the road races, riders will leave the field of play on the left, after passing through the mixed zone on the way to the teams' area. Transponders will also be removed at this stage. The first three riders in each event will be required at the end of the session to attend to several procedures: collect NPC track suit, victory ceremony, mixed zone, doping control and press conference. The escorts will indicate to the athletes the order to follow.

Team Relay

After the end of the Team Relay, riders will leave the field of play on the left, after passing through the mixed zone on the way to the teams' area. The first three teams will be escorted at the end of the competition to attend to several procedures: collect NPC track suit, victory ceremony, mixed zone, doping control and press conference. The escorts will indicate to the athletes the order to follow.







Road Race - Last 3km






PARALYMPIC MIXED TEAM RELAY

8. General	post-com	petition	procedures

Mixed zone

A mixed zone has been planned in every venue and will operate for all competitions. Athletes pass through the mixed zone as they leave the field of play, but they are not obliged to speak to the media if they do not wish. Press Operations, in conjunction with Sport, control the operations of the mixed zone.

Victory ceremonies

There will be a briefing for medallists before each victory ceremony, during which athletes will be shown the route along which they will be led and reminded of their responsibility to adhere to the IPC Manufacturer Identification Guidelines for the Tokyo 2020 Paralympic Games. Only the athletes may be present at this briefing, unless otherwise indicated.

No participant in the victory ceremony should have flags, mascots, a mobile phone, a camera, headphones, sport equipment or other items on them during the ceremony; this is a breach of the IPC Manufacturer Identification Guidelines for the Tokyo 2020 Paralympic Games. Athletes must be wearing their NPC tracksuits. Please also note that no one other than athletes and those who are part of the Victory Ceremonies team (part of Sport Presentation) may be part of the victory ceremony.

During the victory ceremony, the Doping Control team is required to keep a direct line of sight with athletes at all times. It is imperative athletes do not deviate from the prescribed routes outlined in the briefing.

Press conferences

Post-competition press conferences may be held with medallists shortly after every cycling road event. Professional interpretation services will be provided at all press conferences. For cycling road, consecutive interpretation will be available.

Results distribution

There will not be regular distribution of printed results to the NPCs available from SID in the Athletes' Lounge. For certain reports, a limited number of copies will be distributed to team leaders. Results for all sports will be available through Info and myInfo, and the Tokyo 2020 official website.




